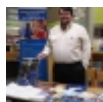


Finding Sigatoka-resistant varieties of bananas and plantains ^[1]

An interdisciplinary team of scientists from the USDA, University of Puerto Rico at Mayaguez and University of Florida, completed a research study to determine the susceptibility of local varieties of bananas and plantains to black Sigatoka, a disease caused by a fungus. They also identified new varieties that are more resistant to black Sigatoka and that could be planted in Puerto Rico in the future.
