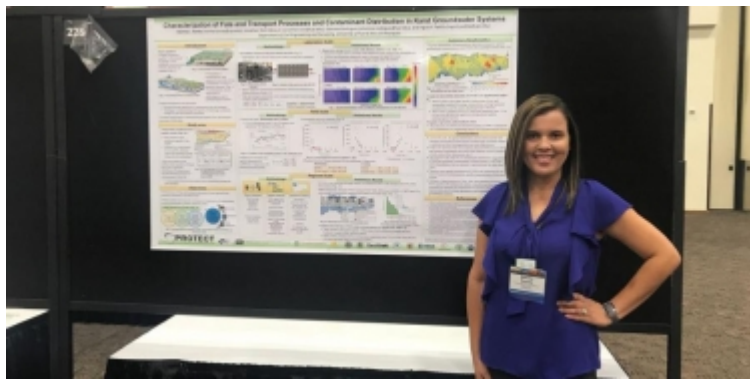


# Puerto Rican student gets \$25,000 grant to research underground waters <sup>[1]</sup>
