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2018 has been a year of big milestones for the Arecibo Observatory (AO). After the passage of the Hurricane Maria, the AO stands stronger and celebrates 55 years of scientific discoveries and innovative hard work, now under the new management team lead by the University of Central Florida (UCF), with the collaboration of the Universidad Metropolitana (UMET) and Yang Enterprises Inc.

To promote the Puerto Rico's iconic scientific facility, exalt its incredible history and embrace its bright future, a week-long event was specially designed by the AO staff: the #AOWeek. Between Oct 28th and Nov 3rd , the #AOWeek activities will take place onsite and online,

aiming to open the gates of the world's most sensitive radar and largest-aperture radio telescope to the public from all over the planet, showing the unique "behind the scenes" of the facility and communicating the investigations performed there in the areas of Radio Astronomy, Planetary Radar and Space and Atmospheric Sciences.
