Who Should Apply?

Current college seniors and recent graduates with a biomedically relevant Bachelor's received within the last 3 years, and who are from historically underrepresented and underserved groups. Applicants must be US citizens or permanent residents.

MSK Bridge Provides:

- Research experience - immersion in biomedical research in cutting-edge laboratories at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center (MSK), and an opportunity to present to the annual MSK Bridge Symposium.
- Community - Scholars will receive guided mentoring by faculty, graduate students and postdocs with social activities to foster community.
- Educational training - participation in a cancer biology core course, professional development workshops and skills building classes, as well as research seminars and departmental talks.
- Professional guidance - individualized career guidance and assistance with the graduate school application process from the Office of Scientific Education and Training.
- Benefits – reimbursement for relocation expenses, an annual stipend of \$45,000, health benefits, and access to MSK rental housing.
