

Global Health Emerging Scholars

A consortium of Yale University, University of California at Berkeley, Stanford University, and University of Arizona

The Global Health Emerging Scholars (GHES) is a training program sponsored by the Fogarty International Center and collaborating Institutes and Centers at the National Institutes of Health (NIH).

GHES provides 12-month research fellowships at 18 collaborating institutions in 16 low- and middle-income countries (LMIC) for US post- and pre-doctoral trainees and LMIC post-doctoral trainees.

Eligible Applicants

Fellows must be supervised by a mentor from one of the four U.S. institutions and an LMIC institution. Candidates seeking assistance in identifying a GHES faculty member should contact us at GHES@yale.edu.

All postdoctoral applicants must be within 5 years of completion of their terminal degree or training.

US applicants

- US citizen or permanent resident
- From any US university
- Can spend 10-12 months at a GHES LMIC site

Postdoctoral applicants

must have a doctoral/professional degree (PhD, DrPH, MD, DO, DVM, DDS).

Predocutorial applicants

must be enrolled in a doctoral/professional degree program.

LMIC applicants

- Must have a doctoral/professional degree (PhD, DrPH, MBBS, MBChB, MD, DO, DVM, DDS, not master's degree)
- Citizen of 16 collaborating LMICs.
- Can spend 1-3 months at GHES US institution.

At A Glance

GHES supports training to address health inequities and improve population health through research in:

- infectious and non-communicable diseases
- HIV/AIDS
- trauma/injury
- mental health
- environmental health and challenges

Timeline

The fellowship year begins with a week-long orientation in July. The fellowship runs through the following June, pending applicant IRB approvals. All trainees must pursue fulltime research for the full duration.

Fellow Support

The fellowship includes a stipend at NIH scale, insurance, travel, and research funds.
