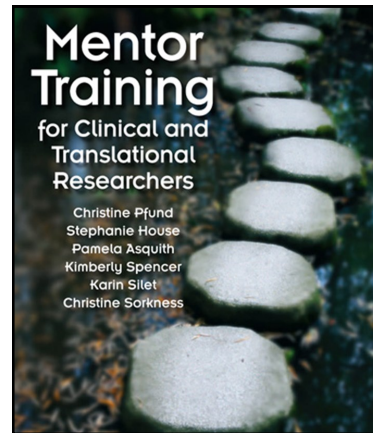

Mentor Training for Clinical and Translational Researchers



This curriculum was tested via a national randomized controlled trial involving 566 mentors and mentees across 16 sites.

Results include:

- Trained mentors reported significantly higher learning gains as compared to the control. They also reported they had implemented more changes in their mentoring practice.
- 88% of training participants reported that the 8-hour seminar was a valuable use of their time and 90% said they would recommend it to a colleague.
- Mentees of trained mentors noted a greater number of positive changes in their mentoring relationship over the study period.

Workshop Elements and Outcomes

- Practice facilitating activities from the training, taking turns in the role of facilitator

Be able to describe evidence supporting the effectiveness of research mentor training

- Learn results from studies assessing its effectiveness

Become familiar with the research mentor training curricula and tools to assess the impact of mentor training

- Overview of curricula options and review the assessment instruments

Be able to articulate practical plans for implementing mentor training at your home institution

- Overview of recruitment, logistics, support and evaluation
