We welcome applications from all interested students and especially encourage those from groups underrepresented in academia to apply. These groups include, but are not limited to: African Americans, Latinos, Native Americans, Pacific Islanders, Filipinos, Vietnamese, those with disabilities, first generation college goers, those from disadvantaged socio-economic backgrounds, and those underrepresented on the basis of sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression. Priority may go to US Citizens and Permanent Residents.

NEW for 2022: PRISM Baker Fellowships

Candidates who interview through PRISM in 2022-23 will be eligible for their postdoc mentor to apply for a PRISM Baker Fellowship, which provides 50% of the salary and benefits for the candidate's first postdoc year.
