



USDA National Needs Doctoral Fellow:
Inter-disciplinary studies on produce safety

There is a fellow position available for a student interested in pursuing a doctoral degree in food science at the Department of Food Science and Technology, the University of Massachusetts, with particular emphasis on non-thermal processing and luminescent probes of produce quality and safety.

The candidates will be appointed as USDA National Needs Fellows with the following benefits:

- Competitive annual stipend
- Educational stipend up to \$2,000
- Full tuition waiver
- Eligibility to attend and receive industry certification for extension programming related to produce safety: Preventive Controls for Human Food, Better Process Control School, & Produce Safety

Eligibility:

- M.S. degree in food science, chemistry, microbiology, or other relevant disciplines. Exceptionally outstanding B.S. students will be considered.
- GPA > 3.2 and GRE V+Q > 300 & AW > 3.5 (iBT), exemption possible.
- Citizen or national of the United States.
- Traditionally under-represented students will receive priority consideration.
